### **Why Liszt in the Garden?**

The Hungarian Cultural Garden was dedicated October 21, 1934, on the 123rd anniversary of the birth of Ferenc Liszt, with the unveiling of the bas-relief plaque of the world famous Hungarian composer. Ever since, the Garden has had a special link with Liszt and music.

*Ferenc (Franz) Liszt (1811–1886)  
was said by his peers to have been the  
most technically advanced pianist of  
his age and perhaps even the greatest  
pianist of all time.*
